Vice President Carter requested that Executive Director Schmidt meet with the Attorney General's Office to discuss the possibilities of high school IEP students to earn full points for graduation, regardless if they do not graduate with their own cohort. He asked that this information be presented at the next meeting.

The committee stated that additional information was needed to determine whether schools with large LDS communities should be penalized for two-year gap during missions. This item will be revisited at a later meeting.

Sean Rickert, representing Pima Unified School District, addressed the committee.

The committee came to a consensus that students that graduate in less than four years will not be incentivized.

The committee came to a consensus to not award credit for minimal proficient

The committee came to a consensus to add an ECAP at the K-8 level as an additional acceleration measure, this measure will be added in the future.
