1. BUSINESS REPORTS

A. President's Report

Dr. Balentine stated the Governor appointed two new Board members and thanked Mr. Lucero and Dr. Nicodemus for their time and commitment to the State Board of Education.

A Special Board Meeting was held April 2, 2010 to discuss and explore the ADE's proposal to eliminate the writing and norm reference tests at various levels. Although the Board took action after further review of the matter the Board will rescind the decision to temporarily limit the statewide writing tests per the ADE's request which will be presented at a scheduled Special Board meeting immediately following the Regular Board meeting.

Dr. Balentine thanked Mr. Yanez for his astute understanding of the budget which led to the reinstatement of the writing tests.

B. Superintendent's Report

Supt. Horne recognized the Innovative and Exemplary Program Unit, the Office of Indian Education and the Office of Dropout Prevention for hosting the 3 day Native American Dropout Prevention Conference. The conference focused on addressing the needs of our Native American students and over 300 attendees participated in the event. The conference is the final culminating event of the 3 year federal grant administered by the ADE to impact two Apache tribal communities, San Carlos and White River.

Ms. Kay Schreiber, Career Counseling and Development Specialist in the Career and Technical Education Unit was also recognized by Supt. Horne for receiving the 2010 Advocate of the Year award from the Arizona State Counselors Association. Supt. Horne said Ms. Schreiber has worked tirelessly in partnership with the Academic Achievement Division on the planning and implementation of the Education and Career Action Plan and she has also been a powerful influence for school counselors. The Career and Technical Education Unit was commended for the Skills USA Arizona Championships, the Arizona DECA Career Development Conference and the Arizona Family, Career and Community Leaders of America Spring Leadership Conference.

Supt. Horne stated Education Technology under the leadership of Ms. Cathy Poplin hosted more than 85 educators from the twelve new American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. The theme was "Off to a Good Start" and emphasized high quality professional development, used of Peer Coaching and strategies for implement 1:1 technology. The twelve districts represent Maricopa, Pima, Cochise, Gila, Graham and Yavapai counties.

Mr. Moore thanked the ADE staff for their work and efforts in the Native American Dropout Prevention Conference and working with the tribal communities.

4. GENERAL SESSION

A. Program update regarding the Arizona LEA Tracker (ALEAT)

Dr. Karen Butterfield stated ALEAT is the Arizona LEA Tracker system is a web-based tool accessed through the ADE's common logon and supports the implementation, monitoring and evaluation of an LEA's NCLB Consolidated Plan. The ALEAT tracker system has been operational since 2008-09 and it is a collaborative project between the South West Comprehensive Center, WestEd, and the ADE. The purpose of the tracker system is to streamline LEA planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the NCLB programs within a single tool.

Ms. Kathy Hrabluk provided information on the important features of the ALEAT and stated all LEA's and charter schools receiving federal funds have access to the tracker system. Ms. Hrabluk provided a list of the goals ALEAT addresses.

- Reading/Math achievement addressing all subgroups including Special Education
- Highly Qualified/Professional Development
- ELL Achievement
- School Safety
- Graduation Rate

- Parent Engagement
- Educational Technology

Ms. Hrabluk stated ALEAT consolidates, coordinates and streamlines the planning, implementation, and monitoring of multiple plans. This system also encourages LEA's to focus on effectiveness of program implementation. Other benefits listed:

- ALEAT Steering Committee that coordinates efforts across programs
- Significant improvement in service delivery and support to LEA's
- Communication between ADE and LEAs

ALEAT also continues to provide opportunities to integrate additional programs and systems such as RTI and ECAPS.

Ms. Nancy Konitzer and Mr. Steve Henneberg demonstrated how districts log on and what is posted on the ALEAT website.

Ms. Ortiz-Parsons asked if everyone have more than 200 action steps. Mr. Steve Henneberg stated the action steps presented are only for the district being used as an example. Every district is different.

B. Presentation and discussion regarding the Common Core State Standards Initiative and Assessment Consortia

Ms. Cheryl Lebo stated the timeline has been extended and the updated draft was provided to the Board. The information between May and June has been changed. Ms. Lebo said the goal for June 28, 2010 is to present the Common Core Standards (English Language Arts and Mathematics) to the Board with the request to adopt the standards. The transition plan will also be presented and there will be a request to post the approved Common Core Standards online for 30 days. During this time, the public will be invited to review the approved Standards and make recommendations on possible Arizona specific additions (maximum 15%).

Dr. Balentine stated a Special Meeting will be required in June to review the information proposed before the Board approves the new standards.

Ms. Lebo also provided an update on the Assessment Consortia and stated WestEd will be involved with the Balanced Assessment Consortia.

Mr. Moore asked if the initial information could be presented to the field as it is received in order to include their input. Ms. Lebo stated as soon as the information is available it will be posted on-line. Mr. Moore asked if there were other subject areas to be considered at a later time. Ms. Lebo stated at this point science has come across but has not been confirmed.

Request to Speak:

- Dr. Sybil Francis, Executive Director of Center for the Future of Arizona stated the state has the opportunity to joining a consortium in category B. Dr. Francis provided an overview of the requirements to join and said her focus is on the Move on When Ready bill and how it aligns to the Board Exam Consortium.
 - C. Presentation and discussion regarding legislative affairs.

 The Board may take action to support, oppose or remain neutral on specific legislative proposals

Ms. Susie Cannata provided an overview of HB2235, HB2281, HB2298, HB2725, HB2731 and HB2732.

SB1040 – Strike everything amendment would require the Board to adopt a teacher and principal evaluation model framework by December 15, 2011.

SB1119 – Require the Board and the ADE to approve mechanisms to allow for participating districts and charters to improve their school classification if the academic gains meet the criteria adopted by ADE and approved by the Board. SB1119 would also require the department to establish procedures to maintain the integrity of testing process and the Board to approve and review the testing process adopted by the task force.

SB1286 – Would require the ADE to maintain an achievement profile for each school district. The previous classification system would be replaced with a letter grade of A through D and F. Fifty percent of the criteria for grading schools and districts must be academic performance measures, and 50% of that must consist of a measurement of the 25% of pupils with the lowest academic gain enrolled in the school or district.

Ms. Cannata stated adjustments have been made to certain bills due to the budget crisis.

D. Presentation, discussion and consideration to accept the recommendation of the Professional Practices Advisory Committee and grant the teacher certification application for Dexter Brown

E. Presentation and discussion regarding the 2009 NAEP Reading results

Ms. Giovannone provided an overview of the data for the 2009 NAEP Reading results for 4th and 8th grade. Arizona grade 8 students showed an increase in achievement levels since 2005. The data presented included the overall scores by:

- Race/ethnicity
- Hispanic achievement levels
- National school program
- Students with disabilities
- English language learners

F. Presentation and discussion regarding the standard setting for AIMS Mathematics

Ms. Roberta Alley provided background information on the mathematics assessments and stated the Board will be considering approving the achievement levels for the new AIMS 3-8 and AIMS high school mathematics assessments in June.

Ms. Alley's presentation included information on the legal requirements and the standard setting meeting dates. Standard setting committees will have a membership of 19 participants for high school and 40 participants for 3-8. Participants will represent educators, parents, and community members. These committees will recommend achievement levels for each grade levels assessment. They will also make recommendations for any needed revisions to the performance level descriptors.

Dr. Fitzpatrick from Pearson provided an overview of the Standard Setting Process that is nationally recognized method of establishing achievement levels. Also presented was information on the difference between content standards vs. performance standards. Dr. Fitzpatrick stated all results and

panel recommendations would be present3ed to the Board on June 4th. Dr. Balentine asked Mr. Yanez for an alternate date to work with ADE staff and Pearson.
