<u>Proficiency:</u> points awarded for partial proficiency (.6), proficiency (1.0) and high proficiency (1.10 to 1.15). 0 points for minimally proficient. Further suggestions from AG request on weighting.

Growth: Combination of SGP and SGT.

SGP to have 5 bands. Lowest band will receive 0 points. Middle band will receive 1 point, band below .5, band above middle band 1.5 and highest band 2.0. ADE to stop averaging the mean.

SGT discussion regarding target 3-8 or 3 years. Support for 3-8. Discussion recredit for maintaining.

Acceleration/readiness measures: chronic absenteeism rejected

No consensus reached re: whether a school with a majority of students below proficiency could be awarded an A.

No consensus reached re: whether a school with a majority of students not meeting growth target could be awarded an A.

Rejected that the amount of Title 1 schools awarded an A must be proportional to the amount of non title 1 schools receiving an A.
