English Language Learners (ELL)	<i>Proficiency on AZELLA (English Learner Assessment)</i> School's percentage of students proficient on AZELLA compared to the 9-12 average ELL proficiency	5%	10%
	<i>Growth on AZELLA</i> School's change in performance levels compared to the 9-12 average change in performance levels in the current year	5%	
High School Graduation Rate	Best of 4-, 5-, 6-, or 7-year calculation of graduation rate	10%	10%
College and Career Readiness	College and Career Readiness (CCR) points determined by averaging the CCR points (approval on CCR rubric to occur January 24, 2022) from current year's seniors	35%	35%
