Background and Discussion

On June 24, 2015, the Arizona Standards Development Committee (ASDC) met in an organizational meeting. At this meeting of the ASDC, "A motion was made by Member Albert and was seconded by Member Rutowski, that the Department of Ed consider for appointment to the ELA and Math Subcommittees all qualified applicants who have submitted materials to be considered Math or ELA subject matter experts through July 8, 2015, unless the person has withdrawn their application for consideration; that priority should be given to any qualified applicant that had previously applied to the Board for membership on the Az Academic Standards Development Committee; and that, pursuant to Board policy, the Department shall provide, along with its recommendations for appointment to the subcommittees, all applications and supporting materials of the qualified applicants considered. Vote on the motion as amended was passed unanimously" (Arizona State Board of Education Minutes, June 22, 2015).

The Department subsequently began the process outlined below in order to identify the most highly qualified applicants to recommend for appointment to the English Language Arts and Mathematics Standards Subcommittees:

- 1. June 24, 2015 Opened the process for application to participate in the Standards Subcommittees
- 2. June 29, 2015 Emailed applicants who applied on or before June 24th with the option of having their application considered for Standards Subcommittees and/or Standards Work Groups

Applications for both K-12 and Higher Education Standards Subcommittee membership were evaluated by a minimum of two raters using a standardized rubric (see attachment). When scores differed, a third rater completed a separate review for consensus. The highest scoring applicants were further considered for Standards Subcommittee recommendation based upon considerations of content and grade level qualifications and other demographics.

• Higher Education:

- Currently employed by an Arizona institute of higher education
 - Alternately, retired from an Arizona public school institute of higher education within the past year.
- Holds a degree in the preferred content area English or Mathematics


Final Selection Process - continued

- Applications for both K-I2 and Higher Education Standards Subcommittee membership were evaluated by a minimum of two raters using a standardized rubric.
- When scores differed, a third rater completed a separate review for consensus.
- All applications receiving a consensus score of 6 or higher were further considered for Standards Subcommittee recommendation by a cross-agency group.
 - Applications were ranked within grade levels based on experience in grade level, content leadership, curriculum experience, prior experience in standards articulation, etc.

ELA and Math Subcommittees County Representation




Percentage of Arizona Students by County




ELA and Math Subcommittees Types of Communities




