- Public comment is limited to three minutes. Once three minutes has expired, you will be asked to conclude your remarks.
- The amount of time to speak may be limited depending on the number of speakers.
- Please be respectful in your comments.
- This is the time to collect public comments; neither staff nor Board members will respond to public comments.
